

Questions and Answers Report

**Q.1: Is it our responsibility to arrange transportation to the island during construction in order to get dumpsters and other equipment on site? I.e. a barge**

A.1: Yes, the contractor must provide their own transportation to the island.

**Q.2: After removal of the loading platform, can you confirm you want that to be lightly graded, with seed and straw vs adding additional rip rap to connect the existing rip rap on the shore line?**

A.2: Yes, light grading with seed and straw is fine.

**Q.3: Will there be a site visit scheduled? If not, can we visit the island on our own? Are there any restrictions to visiting?**

A.3: No, a site visit will not be scheduled. All prospective bidders are encouraged to visit the site on their own to familiarize themselves with the requirements for the project. The island is a public state park and can be visited during daylight hours year-round. Refer to Amendment 2 in eMMA project ID BPM055464 for additional information.

**Q.4: We would like to inquire about the cost of transporting materials to the island. We understand that transportation is the contractor's responsibility per the project manual, and we want to make sure we are accounting for all associated costs accurately in our bid.**

**Could you please point us in the right direction and let us know who the best person would be to speak with regarding material transport logistics and costs to St. Clement's Island?**
